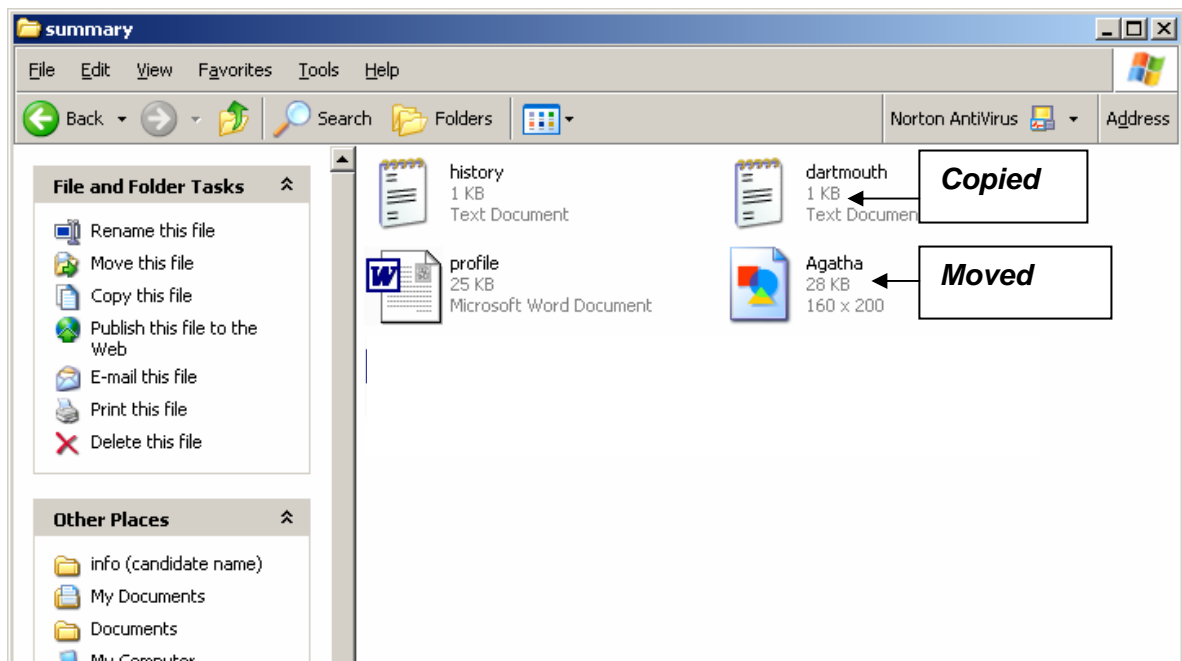
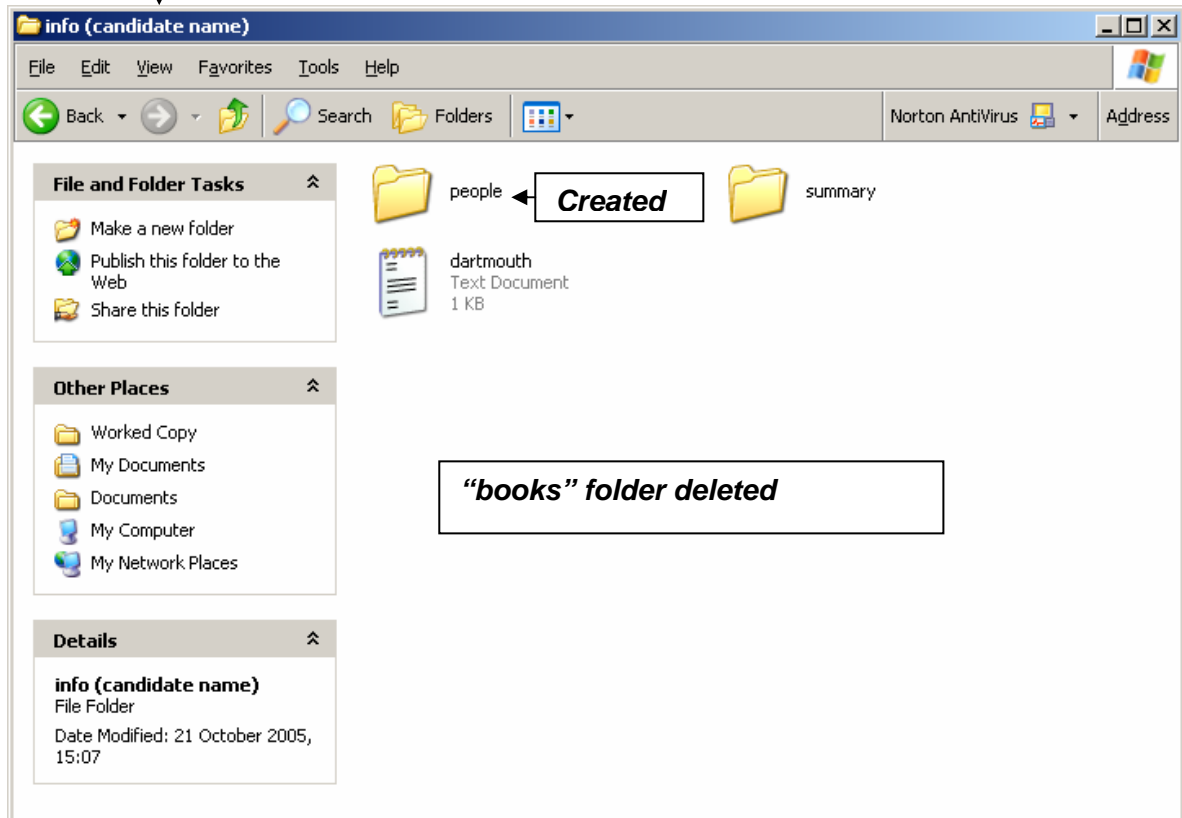

The home of Agatha Christie

Occupying a hillside perch, overlooking the River Dart in South Devon, lies the garden at Greenway...the family home of Agatha Christie. Thanks to the generosity of the crime writer's family, the gardens are now managed by the National Trust and are open to the public.

The Greenway estate, overlooking the River Dart near Galmpton in South Devon, was bought by the Queen of Crime in 1938. It was offered to the trust by Dame Agatha's daughter, Rosalind Hicks, and her husband Anthony, in 1999.

The estate is Grade 2 listed, and the original court was built in the 1600s. Greenway was built a century later, and it is believed that part of the gardens was the work of prisoners from the **Spanish Armada.**
